At Forfar 26 October 1825.

.....appeared James Morgan writer in Edinburgh one of the executors of the deceased James Morgan formerly farmer and afterwards residing at Grange of Connon....declares that the said James Morgan died on the 10th day of September last.deponent and brother William and two sisters Jean & Agnes executors nominated in will dated 9 Nov 1821.

Distribution:

To Jane Kirkcaldy, wife – “lifetime use allinerly of the dwelling house and others presently occupied by me and the horse, cows and keeping thereof together with the meal, potatoes and other perquesites”. Household furniture, linen, etc. together with £100 annually payable at Candlemas and Lammas.

To David Morgan, James Morgan, William Morgan, Jean Morgan, Agnes Morgan £100 stg. annually payable by David Morgan for 19 years. David Morgan has already been given the lease of Grange of Connon.

James, William, Jean & Agnes get the crop, stocking, furniture, books, plate, bank notes etc. and should the daughters not marry they get the house etc. after their mother dies.
