William Spiers died about 1764; married in 1718 Janet Ker, daughter of John Ker, dr. of a farmer and shipowner, par. of Borrowstounness, m<sup>d</sup>. A third time in 1761 Isabella Thomson. Born about 1726, died 4<sup>th</sup> May 1806; servant to the minister of the Secession Church at Dennyloanhead; (she afterwards married successively (but without family) James Russell, of Sauchie Rig, a widower, John Marshall, farmer East Borland, west of Denny, and John Denovan, farmer, Knowehead, - all elders of the Church at Dennyloanhead); he was a farmer on Castlecary Estate, he dealt in Linseed, and traded along with others at Boness. He bought Loch Green Estate, par. of Falkirk, about 1730. He was an elder in Falkirk parish church, and afterwards in the Secession Church at Dennyloanhead from its formation in 1738.

## William's family were:

<u>Margaret Spiers</u>, baptized 3<sup>rd</sup> May 1719; probably married James Brown, parish of Falkirk. They left the district and were lost sight of. They had one child called William Brown, baptized 26<sup>th</sup> November 1741.

William Spiers, named after father's father), bapt. 24<sup>th</sup> Feb 1723, would die a child.

<u>Ann Spiers</u>; married in 1734 William Roughhead, farmer and laird in the parish of Denny. (prob. no family). She was a woman of superior qualifications having staid a good while with her uncle, the Revd. Robert Spiers, Linlithgow parish.

William Spiers, bapt. 3<sup>rd</sup> Aug 1750; unmarried. He used to study at a favourite spot near Loch Green House, and according to his desire was buried there. It is surrounded by a stone wall, and is known as The Tomb.

Robert Spiers, (m.f.?) bap. 16 Nov 1731, died Sept 1818; m<sup>d</sup>. 1759 Agnes Russell, d<sup>r</sup>. of William Russell, laird of the Arns, m<sup>d</sup>. again (but no family) Jean Muirhead, but died 10<sup>th</sup> January 1812; he succeeded his father in the posession of the major part of Loch Green estate. He was ordained an elder in Dennyloanhead Secession Church 1778.

<u>Janet Spiers</u>, (f.m.?) bapt 24<sup>th</sup> Oct 1734; married William Hay, laird of Arnbog, son of Robert Hay, farmer, Netherwood, par. of Cumbernauld, and Helen Russell.

Jean Spiers, twin sister of Janet; married Thomas Rennie, probably a labouring man. (There was probably no family that survived herself.)

<u>Ebenezer Spiers</u>, bapt 23 Feb 1739, died a young man. He studied for the ministry, but was unlicensed.

Elizabeth Spiers, bapt. 7<sup>th</sup> Oct 1747, died about five years old.

<u>David Spiers</u>, bapt. 6<sup>th</sup> Sept 1762, died 28<sup>th</sup> Dec 1752; married Janet Morrison, born about 1766, died 23<sup>rd</sup> Dec. 1857; d<sup>r</sup>. of William Morrison, blacksmith, Holmbush, west from Dennyloanhead, and Janet Lamond. Burnhouse was left to him by his father as his share of Loch Green Estate, and he went there when he was seventeen. He was ordained an elder in Dennyloanhead Secession Church 25 Feb. 1795.
