David Hoge in ffrouchie in the parish of ffrouchie and Margaret Youell in this declared their mutual purpose of marriage on Saturday the 28th of March 1713 by giving up their names to be publicly proclaimed and in testimony of their Banes matrimonial consigned two crowns before these witnesses James Youll cau^{rs} that there shall be no abuse at the wedding John Philip and David Keadie and being threie orderly proclaimed and nothing objected were married on Thursday 11th June 1713 witnesses forsaied.

Although the word at the end of the third line above is clearly 'Banes' it is probably 'pawns'. This means, according to The Concise Scots Dictionary, 'the sum of money deposited by the couple as a guarantee of their intention to marry within 40 days and of their chaste conduct in the interval.'

This is the second family wedding which has had this 'no abuse' clause. Not everyone had this clause inserted. What does it mean about this family?
