

Charles Albert Smith Edith Elizabeth Vallé

Charles & Elizabeth were married in Lambeth on 3rd September 1899. He was a warehouseman, bachelor aged 23 and she an umbrella finisher, spinster and aged 22. His father was John William Smith and his mother Rosina Ing. Her parents were Joseph Hallihan Vallé and Eliza Gladman. The witnesses at the wedding were her father and her half sister, Frances Eliza Evans:

1899 Marriage St Peter's Lambeth, London. No. 368 3 Sept 1899.

Husband: Charles Albert Smith, 23, bachelor, warehouseman, 58 Liverpool Street, (father John William Smith, Engineer).

Wife: Edith Elizabeth Vallé, 22 spinster, umbrella finisher, 58 Liverpool Street, (father Joseph Hallahan Vallé, cheesemonger).

Witnesses: Joseph Hallihan Vallé, Frances Eliza Evans.

On August third the following year, their first child, Reginald Charles was born at 10 Blucher Road, Camberwell, Lambeth.

Birth 1900 Camberwell, London No. 404. 3 Aug 1900 10 Blucher Road.

Child: Reginald Charles, boy, father Charles Albert Smith, warehouse assistant, mother Edith Elizabeth Smith formerly Vallé. Informant: Edith E Smith 10 Blucher Road.

In the 1901 census at 10 Blucher Road, Camberwell, in four of the six rooms are Sidney Evans (Edith's half brother), his wife and child and Charles and Edie with Reginald:

In the first two rooms:

Sidney Evans, head, married, 30, provision warehouseman, worker, Hackney

Florence Evans, wife, married, 28, Camberwell

Sidney Evans, son, 3, Camberwell

and in the remaining two rooms:

Charles A Smith, head, married, 24, cheesemongers warehouseman, Lambeth

Edith E Smith, wife, married, 24, Hackney

Reginald C Smith, son, 8mo., Camberwell

A second child, Charles Alfred E Smith was born Jan-March 1903. (Lambeth 1d 498.)

Ten years later in the 1911 census we find at 52 Lorrimore St. Southwark.

Sub-district: Newington South. Dist 7. Parish: St. Mary Newington.

Charles Albert Smith, head, married, 33, provision warehouseman, Walnut Tree Walk, Westminster.

Edie Elizabeth Smith, wife, married, 34, (married 11 years), St. Annes Pl., Hackney

Reginald Charles Smith, son, unmarried, 10, Blucher Rd., Camberwell.

Charles A W Smith, son, 7, Lorrimore St. Kennington.

The addresses are more detailed than usual although Walnut Tree Walk is in Lambeth, not Westminster!
