Below is a 1719 tack of Russell Miln in favour of William Inglis and John Inglis.

From the remnant members of the Town Council and Dean of Crafts of the sd Burgh Conform to Act of Council Dated the first of December Inst on the one part and William and John Inglises present Tenents in Russels Miln on the other part in manner underwritten That is to say the saids Baillies Dean of Guild, the sd William Rigg the sd

..... and Deacon Convener of the Trades of the sd Burgh for themselves and as having commission in manner forsaid Do set and in Tack & Assedation Let to the saids William and John Inglises their heirs Conll ? and a llie Secluding Subtenents all and hail the town and Lands of Russelsmiln with the Miln and Miln Lands thereof Multures and Sequels of the same miln with the houses biggings parts & pertinents with the pasturage of the common Town Sheep upon the common Muir and Loans Conform to use and wont and also all and hail These eighteen acres of arrable Land pertaining to the sd Burgh Lying in the parks as the same are all presently possessed by the sds William and John Inglises and that for all the Days Space and years of Three Years upon Three Years for the space of Nine Years cropts next and immediately after the term of Michaelmass next to come Jajvije and nineteen years which is hereby declared to be the term of their Entry to the sd Lands by virtue of this present Tack and the Term of Martinmass Immediately thereafter as to the miln and to be thenceforth Laboured occupied and possess by the sds Tenents and their forsds during the years of this present Tack quietly freely well & in peace but any impediment whatsoever Which Tack the sds Baillies Dean of Guild and Deacon Convener for themselves and their successors in office Bind and oblige them to warrand to be good and sufficient to the saids Tenants and their forsds at all hands and against all Deadly as Law will For the which causes the sds William and John Inglis Bind and oblige them Cojunctlie And Seaverallie their heirs executors Successors and Intromettors with their Goods and Gear whatsoever to Make Good and Thankful payment yearly and Ilk year during the currency of this Tack to the present and Succeeding ..... f the sd Burgh for the use & behove of the Town Council and Community thereof the particular Duties underwritten vist of the sum of One Hundred and eighty six pounds Scots Money at Two Terms in the year Martinmass & Whitsunday be equal portions and that as the rent for the sds Lands of Russels Miln , Miln & Miln Lands thereof with the number of Twenty five poultry fowls yearly att the Terms used & wont and to

Church thereof for the Time the nnumber of eight bolls sufficient oatmeal Mercat met & Merchant ware at the Terms of payment and delivery thereof used and wont And Sicklike the saids William & John Inglises Bind and oblige them and their forsd to Free and Relieve the Magistrats and Town Council of the sd Burgh of Cupar and their Successors in office during the hail years of this Tack from payment of the Vicarage Teinds payable out of the said Lands of Russels miln and to Report Discharges as thereof to the sds Magistrats And Further the sds William and John Inglises Bind and Oblige them and their forsd to upkeep and furnish the sd miln in Laying and Going Gear and in Crubbles & Wheels and in all other Things as well not named as named that the sd Miln shall stand in need of and to uphold the miln Trows and the Walls & Roofs of the sd Miln, Kiln & hail Houses upon the Ground of the sds Lands and to furnish great and small Timber thereto and that during the years of the Tack upon their own proper charges and Expences and to leave the sd Miln, Kiln, Houses, Trows and Lands in a Good and Sufficient Condition at their removal therefrom And both parties oblige them to perform the promisses hime inde? to others under the penalty of Fifty pounds Scots to be paid by the partie failzier to the party observer and by attour the Implementing of the premisses Consenting thir presents be Registrat in the Books of Counceil & Session or in any other Competent to have the strength of an Decreet that horning on six days may pass thereon and other Exells needful And They constitute John Imrie and John Annan Writers in Cupar Their Prors In witness whereof (written be John Imrie Clark of Cupar on Stamped Paper) Both the saids parties have Subscribed thir presents ...
